Welcome & Greeting

Reader: In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Response: Amen.**

Grace, mercy and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ be with you.

Round the throne of God, day and night they never cease to sing, 'Holy, holy, holy is the Lord God Almighty, who was and is and is to come.'

Revelation 4 v8

We have too often exchanged the worship of the living God for idols of our own imagining.

As we gather to offer our praises to the holy and undivided Trinity, and to worship him in spirit and in truth, let us call to mind our sins.

Silence is kept

Father, you come to meet us when we return to you: Lord, have mercy.

Lord, have mercy.

Jesus, you died on the cross for our sins: Christ, have mercy.

Christ, have mercy.

Spirit, you give us life and peace: Lord, have mercy.

Lord, have mercy.

Glory to God in the highest, and peace to God's people on earth. Lord God, heavenly King, almighty God and Father, we worship you, we give you thanks, we praise you for your glory.

Lord Jesus Christ, only Son of the Father, Lord God, Lamb of God, you take away the sin of the world: have mercy on us; you are seated at the right hand of the Father, receive our prayer.

For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High,

Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. Amen.

Let us pray that the Spirit will work through our lives to bring Christ to the world.

A Collect for the Third Sunday after Trinity

Almighty God, you have broken the tyranny of sin and have sent the Spirit of your Son into our hearts whereby we call you Father:
Give us grace to dedicate our freedom to your service, that we and all creation may be brought to the glorious liberty of the children of God; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

The Epistle is written in the epistle to the Romans, the sixth chapter, beginning to read at the twelfth verse.

Therefore, do not let sin exercise dominion in your mortal bodies, to make you obey their passions. No longer present your members to sin as instruments of wickedness, but present yourselves to God as those who have been brought from death to life, and present your members to God as instruments of righteousness. For sin will have no dominion over you, since you are not under law but under grace.

What then? Should we sin because we are not under law but under grace? By no means! Do you not know that if you present yourselves to anyone as obedient slaves, you are slaves of the one whom you obey, either of sin, which leads to death, or of obedience, which leads to righteousness? But thanks be to God that you, having once been slaves of sin, have become obedient from the heart to the

form of teaching to which you were entrusted, and that you, having been set free from sin, have become slaves of righteousness. I am speaking in human terms because of your natural limitations. For just as you once presented your members as slaves to impurity and to greater and greater iniquity, so now present your members as slaves to righteousness for sanctification.

When you were slaves of sin, you were free in regard to righteousness. So what advantage did you then get from the things of which you now are ashamed? The end of those things is death. But now that you have been freed from sin and enslaved to God, the advantage you get is sanctification. The end is eternal life. For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.

The Nicene Creed

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

The Celebration of the Sacrament

Be present, be present, Lord Jesus Christ our risen high priest; make yourself known in the breaking of bread. **Amen**.

Lord, yours is the greatness and the power and the glory and the victory and the majesty; for all things come from you and of your own we give you. **Amen**.

Christ our passover has been sacrificed for us therefore let us celebrate the feast.

Father, Lord of all creation, we praise you for your goodness and your love. When we turned away you did not reject us. You came to meet us in your Son, welcomed us as your children

and prepared a table where we might feast with you.

In Christ you shared our life that we might live in him and he in us.

He opened wide his arms upon the cross and, with love stronger than death, he made the perfect sacrifice for sin.

Lord Jesus Christ, our redeemer, on the night before you died you came to table with your friends.

Taking bread, you gave thanks, broke it and gave it to them saying, Take, eat: this is my body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of me. Lord Jesus, we bless you: you are the bread of life.

At the end of supper you took the cup of wine, gave thanks, and said, Drink this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you & for many for the forgiveness of sins; do this in remembrance of me.

Lord Jesus, we bless you: you are the true vine.

Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ: dying, you destroyed our death, rising, you restored our life;

Lord Jesus, come in glory. Holy Spirit, giver of life, come upon us now; May this bread and wine be to us the body and blood of our Saviour Jesus Christ. As we eat and drink these holy gifts make us, who know our need of grace, one in Christ, our risen Lord.

Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, Blessed Trinity: With your whole Church throughout the world we offer you this sacrifice of thanks and praise and lift our voice to join the song of heaven, for ever praising you and saying:

Holy, Holy, Holy Lord, God of power and might. Heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest.

Thanks be to you, our God, for your gift beyond words. Amen. Amen.

Being made one by the power of the Spirit, as our Saviour taught us, so we pray

The Re-Opening of Church - Sunday 2nd August

As you will be aware local government announced that churches are free to consider re-opening from -effectively - Sunday 4th July. After a period of reflection within the Covid Committee of the Select Vestry the recommendation for St Gall's is that we will not re-open in July. We shall aim to re-open on Sunday 2nd August.

This date is itself subject to review nearer the time. It is our target date for now.

My thanks to the Covid Committee team who have worked hard to prepare the church building for reopening. They have divided the pews into twenty eight household seating spaces, each separated by 2 metres distancing. Hand sanitisers will be available and will be required to be used once we return to church. A plan for seating is drawn up and we are looking for a team of volunteers to work as stewards and ushers. Could this be you? Contact Steve Garland on Tel. 91468891 if you willing to work as a volunteer. PPE will be provided for these volunteers. We shall be recording who shall be attending in support of the government 'track and trace' scheme should someone attending church is later found to have Covid-19. Face masks should be worn.

As many of you will be aware, from the end of March we have had ongoing cases of Covid-19 within our own community. Indeed, as I write this I am praying for some who are awaiting test results to see if they are positive for the disease.

'An abundance of caution' is the phrase in my mind as we consider our re-opening as a church family.

There is a lot more information to come. I just wanted to share some of the fundamentals with you now. I shall be making a series of Youtube videos to outline just what will be involved in coming back to church under the new regulations and these shall be available nearer the time. These should give each of us a sense of what to expect - and also what shall be expected of us as we attend.
